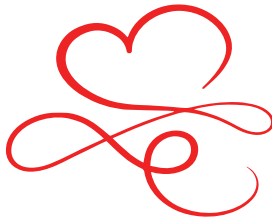

This involves carving out quality time to read the Scriptures, worship, and pray/meditate continually, so that God can reveal and mature you in Christ. Scripture also promises that when you seek God, you will find rest for your weary soul, strength, and abundant life, as God replaces the heaviness of worldly striving with Christ's easy yoke and light burden. In summary, the Bible teaches that you can find God when you seek whole heartedly through devotion, prayer, and meditation. The promise of God is to be available to those who diligently pursue an intimate relationship with God the Father.

Christianity is fundamentally about a relationship with God the Father, through the person of Jesus Christ and the power of the Holy Spirit. While learning the life and teachings of Christ is crucial, our goal is to know and experience God the Father. In Christianity, studying the life and teachings of Christ is indeed fundamental to understanding the biblical directive. However, it is important to note that Christ Himself emphasized the importance of connecting with God the Father. This is clear in the Lord's Prayer, where Christ taught his disciples to pray, "Our Father who art in Heaven" (Matthew 6:9-13). This prayer serves as a model for how Christians should communicate with God, emphasizing the relationship between God as a Father and Gods children. It's true at times the focus on studying Christ and His teachings can lead to a loss of emphasis on seeking a direct connection with God the Father. However, it does not diminish the importance of studying Christ; rather, it highlights the need for a balanced approach that encompasses both understanding Christ's teachings and nurturing a personal relationship with God the Father.

According to the Scripture, God wants people to be close, to experience blessings, and fulfill their purpose by the power of Gods Spirit, and love God with all their hearts. Additionally, God desires that people love kindness, do justice, and walk humbly with Christ. This is summarized in the commandments to love God with all our heart, soul, and mind, and to love our neighbors as ourselves. Ultimately, the overarching theme is that God wants a personal and intimate relationship with individuals, characterized by love, surrender, and righteousness.

The apostle Paul points to a higher, better, wisdom, which he does teach to those who are mature, meaning those who are in Christ and have God's Spirit with them. Paul describes this wisdom of God as secret and hidden. God decreed this wisdom before "the ages"—before time began—for the glory of those who believe in Christ.

God's wisdom is secret and hidden in the sense that it cannot be obtained by mere observation of the world. Evidence can point towards God (Psalm 19:1), but it won't help those who don't want to seek God (Matthew 7:7–8). God's wisdom is above and beyond what humans can perceive in our natural state apart from Him (Isaiah 55:8–9). God must reveal Wisdom to us, or we will not be aware of it.

Paul describes mere human wisdom, with its limited perspective, as fatally incomplete in understanding the gospel of Jesus Christ. Reason and evidence are important, but they do not force a person to accept the truth (James 2:19; Romans 1:18–23).

In the 1600s Jakob Boehme wrote about finding God: "The **Disciple** asked the **Master**: Master, how may I come to the hidden Wisdom of God, so that I may see God, and hear God speak?

The Master answered and said: When you can throw yourself into That, where no Creature dwells, if only for a Moment, then you will hear God speak.

Disciple. Is that place where no Creature dwells near at hand; or is it far off?

Master. It is in you. And if you can, for a time, cease from all your own thinking and willing, then you will hear the unspeakable Words of God.

Disciple. How can I hear God speak, when I stand still from thinking and willing?

Master. When you stand still from the thinking of Self, and the willing of Self; when both your intellect and will are quiet, and passive to the Expressions of the Eternal Word and Spirit; and when your Soul is winged up, and above that which is temporal, the outward Senses, and the Imagination being locked up by holy abstraction, then the Eternal Hearing, Seeing, and Speaking will be revealed in you; and so, God hears and sees through you, being now the Organ of God's Spirit; and so, God speaks in you, and whispers to your Spirit, and your Spirit hears God's Voice.

Blessed are you therefore if you can stand still from Self-thinking and Self-willing and can stop the prevailing of your Imagination and Senses; for thus you may arrive at length to see the great Salvation of God being and be in earnest. What is there required of you, but to stand still, and see the Salvation of your God? And could you want anything less? For God knows what is best; and if you can but trust God will most certainly do better for you, than if you were left to your own Choice".

The overarching promise is that by knowing God intimately, we will experience Gods faithfulness, His power to transform us, and Gods unbreakable love - even during life's difficulties. The more we seek to truly know God, the more we will see these promises fulfilled in our lives. Meeting God in silence is not about hearing a specific message, but about simply being present with Him. It's about acknowledging God's control and finding intimacy and peace through His presence.

And in the end, with grace we stand, United in spirit, hand in hand.

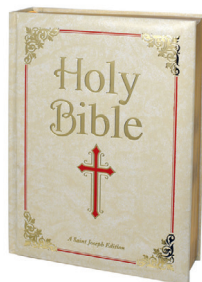
The peace of God
